All our members have been working vigorously to make sure that we are keeping our members safe, their families safe and the community. As we all know Covid-19 has brought on some big challenges and we want each of you to know that we are doing everything possible to make sure that our community is as safe. When you need us, we will be there! During the Covid-19 all calls are screened for any symptoms of the virus. During that time, the proper Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) will be worn for your safety as well as our members and families. Rest assured that none of our members will run calls when showing symptoms of the virus. We are here to support and answer any needs and we will continue to do that the best we can. We are here for you.

In the spring of 2020, before Covid-19 took place in our community, we had an overly exciting event planned to give back to you, if you had not seen it announced. Due to the Covid-19 it has had to be postponed until the Spring of 2021. The members of SVFD had already put a lot of planning into the event for each of your families. Your SVFD firefighters have planned a family fun filled day that will be completely free to attend and get to know the firemen and members of SVFD. Now a quick update for you on some great accomplishments that the last 12 months has brought to SVFD to help us serve you. Did you know that it costs thousands of dollars to put fire hose on the fire engines? Providing the tools, training, and equipment to save lives and protect property is an expensive task. SVFD took on the challenge of providing the highest quality fire service apparatus and equipment to answer call for help in our community. Your donations in the past year has allowed us to maintain equipment. Below are a few highlights of the last 12 months:

- Two of the engines received new tires
- Two engines needed the air conditioners replaced and upkeep maintained
- Purchased 1100 feet of new hose for Engine 1
- Equipped 3 members with new complete set of gear
- A fireman will receive new set of gear once completion of Firefighter 1 training at the end of the year

Fact check: Did you know that it is nearly \$8000.00 to equip one firefighter with complete gear?

- All radio batteries have been replaced
- Three new intake valves on the engines

- Replaced a chainsaw
- All new pagers for the members
- Purchased new vests for fire traffic safety
- The most recent, we were awarded a Grant for all new air packs for every member at SVFD. This was a huge accomplishment.

These are a few of the highlights that has taken place that could not have happened without the help of our community with your gracious donation each year. The SVFD members appreciates any donation to help us meet the departments goals and any unforeseen issues. Donations are tax deductible as we are a Not for Profit organization. Every dollar you donate helps SVFD serve a person in need. You and your donation play a critical role in helping our community and your kindness exemplifies strength, pride and spirit of our great community. We are a volunteer organization with nearly 27 active fire fighters of which 17 are certified members that volunteer hundreds of hours each year. We are also comprised of 8 support staff that generally volunteer fewer hours and are just as important as our firemen. While financial contributions are most needed, there are real opportunities for any teenager or adult to volunteer in a capacity where they are comfortable. Each year, the members of the fire department are willing to visit private residences to change batteries on smoke / CO detectors or review fire escape plans.
